The 2023 Show Recipe A Delicious Fruit Loaf

Ingredients

4oz/115g soft butter or margarine 1 cup sugar 1 cup milk 1 cup of mixed fruit 2 cups self-raising flour 1 beaten egg

(1 cup = 240 ml or 8 fluid oz)

Method

Heat the oven to 160C

Melt the margarine, sugar, milk in a saucepan, add the fruit, bring to the boil and then allow to cool. Fold in the flour and add the beaten egg. Place in a 1lb loaf tin. Sprinkle with a little sugar. Bake at 160 for 90 minutes.

Class 22 Present on a show tray

Put into water and clean with a soft brush. Classes 24-26

Show on a plate with parsley stalks for decoration.

Clean as above. Cut off tops at 3"/8cm. Classes 27-29

Display on show bench.

Class 30 Remove outer skins down to white stem.

Tie leaves with green twine to prevent damage.

Lift and show intact. Class 31

Lift ten days before. Remove cracked outer skins. Classes 33 & 34

Cut off top to 3-4 "/9cms and bend over, securing with raffia.

Classes 36-37 Pick and wipe with damp cloth.

Class 38 Remove damaged leaves only

Classes 40-41 Present with stems/calyces

Classes 43-45 Display on a plate.


