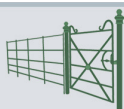

THE 2024 SHOW RECIPE

APPLE CAKE



Ingredients

225g butter softened, plus extra for greasing

450g Bramley or sharp apples

Finely grated zest and juice of 1 lemon

225g caster sugar, plus extra for dredging

3 large eggs

225g self-raising flour

2tsp baking powder

25g ground almonds

1 tbsp Demerara sugar

1. Preheat oven to 180* /fan 160* /Gas 4. Grease a 23/24cm spring form cake tin and line with baking paper. Peel, core and cut the apples into 1cm pieces, and toss in lemon juice.

2. Cream together the butter, caster sugar and lemon zest until pale and fluffy. Beat in the eggs, one at a time, adding a little flour with each addition to keep the mix smooth.

3. Sift the remaining flour and the baking powder into the bowl and fold in with the ground almonds. Drain the apple pieces well, then stir into the mix.

4. Spoon into the prepared tin, level the top and sprinkle with the Demerara sugar. Bake in the oven for 1 hour or until well-risen (cover with baking paper at about 45 minutes if it starts to brown too much). After moving from tin, dredge with caster sugar.

The committee have the right to disqualify any exhibit in Divisions 1 and 2 if proved not to have been grown by the competitor. The committee have the right of entry to allotments and gardens to view proposed entries.

The committee will appoint competent judges whose decisions in all cases are final.

No exhibitor may take more than one prize in any class.

Any complaints or objections should be made in writing to the secretary before 3pm on the day of the show. Such objections or complaints shall be considered by the officers and tent stewards, whose decision shall be final.

Any infringement of the rules shall disqualify the exhibitor.

The committee shall not be held responsible for any mishap or accident arising from attendance at the show.

In the event of a tie for a cup the award shall go to the competitor with the most first, second or third prizes.

Any prize money not collected by 4.30pm on the day shall be classed as a donation to the show.

Tips for successful showing
Division 2
Class 22 Present on a show tray **Classes 23-25** Put into water and clean with a soft brush. Show on a plate with parsley stalks for decoration. **Classes 26-27** Clean as above. Cut off tops at 3"/8cm. Display on show bench.
Class 29 Remove outer skins down to white stem. Tie leaves with green twine to prevent damage. **Class 31** Lift and show intact. **Classes 31-33** Lift ten days before. Remove cracked outer skins. Cut off top to 3-4"/9cms and bend over, securing with raffia. **Classes 35-36** Pick and wipe with damp cloth. **Class 38** Flowers if possible. **Classes 39-40** Present with stems/calyces. **Classes 42** Display on a plate.
