Herons noted in various locations around the villages

Nick and Alison have lots of tadpoles in their ponds but poor John has none!

Sarah Scotter has a great number of tadpoles in her ponds thanks to our efforts.

SR highlighted that we shouldn't move tadpoles from one pond to another.

Lamium with variegated leaves brought in by Annie who shared it is a really good pollinator which overs good ground cover. If anyone wants any please ask Annie.

Hover flies are the 2nd most effective pollinator after bees and often people mistake hover flies for bees and hornets. Lots of different sorts of hover flies. Top 5 plants for hover flies are blackberry, heathers, ivy, guelder rose, fiddleneck (green manure)

SR opened her wood burner and a big bumble bee and recently a large hornet came out covered in soot.

Watch out for Asian hornets which have previously been spotted in the village and if one is spotted should be reported using the Asian Hornet Watch app.

Red kites have been flying low locally but are supposed to only take carrion however, Annie reported two deposited a mauled bantam chicken in her garden recently!

SW's gardener has a client who has chopped down a huge old tree and Sue now has a large number of bees around the log donated to her by the gardener, obviously attracted to the remains of an old bees nest which must have been in the tree. SW has two hedgehogs visiting her feeder every evening and they are happy to feed in there together, which indicates that they are related.
