



Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year from the Chief Executive

Welcome to our end of year festive edition of Parish and Partners in where we look back over the previous year and look forward to what will face us in the New Year.

It has been a momentous year in relation to the Council as we come to terms with the Government decision that through local government reorganisation, Stratford-on-Avon District Council will be abolished in April 2028. On local government reorganisation I will return to this issue and the next steps later in this column, however, I did want to pull out first some of the achievements of the Council over the last year.

Firstly, in relation to planning the Council is working in partnership with Warwick District Council on the joint South Warwickshire Local Plan. This plan will, when adopted, help shape the future housing development across our area. Good progress has been made in this area over the last year and in 2026 we plan to come forward with further proposals for consultation.

Stratford-on-Avon District Council has a good track record of delivering housing, however, during the last year the Government has changed the method by which housing need is calculated. The result of these changes has meant that more housing will be needed from our area than previously required. We are working with our partners to ensure that this additional development is properly considered, further updates on this will be provided during the coming year.

Addressing Climate Change has been an important issue for the Council last year. In February the Climate Change and Nature Recovery Strategy was adopted, which has led to several initiatives such as installing solar panels on the roofs of the leisure centres and providing grants to schemes across the whole of the district.

We are particularly proud of the heath screening programme that has been launched in partnership with the Graham Fulford Charitable Trust at our leisure centres in Stratford, Southam, Studley, and Alcester, with a further events being held in Shipston and Henley. Almost 1,000 tests were conducted focusing on prostate cancer, diabetes, and high cholesterol. These tests have been successful in almost 400 referrals for these conditions. Thank you to everyone who took part.

The year has been dominated however with discussions surrounding the future of the Council through local government reorganisation. At the meeting of Council on 17 November 2025, in response to the invitation from the Minister for Local Government, Stratford-on-Avon District Council has decided to support the implementation of a South Warwickshire Unitary Council when the District Council is abolished.

It is expected that early in the new year the Government will formally consult on both a single unitary Warwickshire, based on the existing County Council boundary and a two unitary Warwickshire based in on North/South split. Following the consultation the Government is then expected to announce their decision in the Summer of next year. As we have been, we will keep you up to date of developments in this area.

Finally, thank you again for all your support. I hope that you all manage to get some down time over the Christmas period, and I would like to wish you a Merry Christmas and a very happy new year.

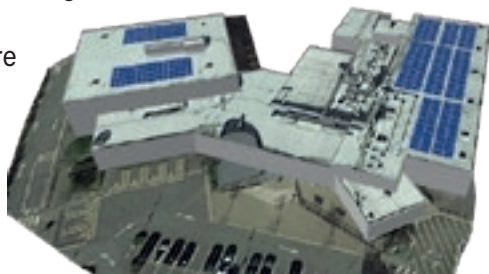

Although the District Council acts as the collecting agent, it only receives 7.1% of Council Tax paid by residents, retaining 7.1p of every £1 paid. WCC receives 76%, the Police 12.8% and Towns/Parishes 3.5%.

Council Plan Priority Achievements - Economic Support



- Local company, The Pinwheel Patisserie from Chesterton Fields Farm received help on marketing and financial planning through the Business Resilience and Growth programme, which forms part of the Business Growth Warwickshire programme.
- Warwickshire's Business Energy and Advice Service (WBEAS) supported Sheldon's Wine Cellars in Shipston to access grants helping to improve their energy performance and efficiency and potentially save over £2,500 per year on their energy costs.
- Local Warwickshire business, Spotty Pots, in Studley benefited from a Warwickshire Business Energy Advice Service (WBEAS) grant to improve their energy efficiency and reduce energy bills.

Council Plan Priority Achievements - Environmental Support

SDC rates second best in Warwickshire Climate Action



Some highlights of progress achieved so far this year include:

- February 2025: Adopted a Climate Change and Nature Recovery Strategy.
- March 2025: 13 projects awarded funding in the second round of the Community Climate and Nature Fund.
- March 2025: Installed solar panels on Shipston and Stratford leisure centres.
- May 2025: Relunched the LCE programme.
- May 2025: Opened round three of the Community Climate and Nature Fund, with £150,000 of funding being available for the 25/26 financial year.
- June 2025: Secured £20,000 for the delivery of the "Wilder Communities" project in collaboration with the Wildlife Trust.
- June 2025: Secured a further £35,000 for the delivery of the third round of the Free Trees for Farmers scheme.
- November 2025: Six projects awarded funding in the third round of the Community Climate and Nature Fund.



The Trees Call for Action Project (TCAP) was launched by the Heart of England Forest in partnership with Stratford-on-Avon District Council, Warwick District Council and Wychavon District Council in 2022, thanks to a grant of £499,446 from the Trees Call to Action Fund. **This initiative lead to 41,734 trees being planted across Stratford-on-Avon District.**

- In April, approximately 400 panels were installed at Stratford Leisure Centre followed by 168 panels installed at Shipston Leisure Centre.

Actual Performance (Since April 2025):

- Stratford Leisure Centre has already generated 89,300 KWh of clean electricity, saving 17.3 tonnes of CO2. PIC
- Shipston Leisure Centre has generated 42,700 KWh, resulting in a CO2 saving of 8.26 tonnes.

Projections for the first 12 months (subject to seasonal weather and fluctuations through autumn and winter) are:

- Projected electricity generation: in the region of 200,000 – 220000Kwh
- Projected CO2 savings: annual savings of approximately 40-45 tonnes of CO2



Environmental Support *continued*

- Home Upgrade Grant scheme - home energy upgrades delivered to over 110 properties through the second phase of the Home Upgrade Grant (HUG2), with energy efficiency measures such as loft insulation, cavity wall insulation, high heat retention electric storage heaters and solar photovoltaic power systems successfully installed.
- Second round of the Community Climate and Nature Fund supported 8 projects with £150,000 of funding - [Case study - CCNF case study - LED streetlighting installation in Bearley](#)

- Recycling service expands for the collection of plastic bags and wrapping.
- Two new community climate change projects unveiled: Free Trees for Town and Parish Councils and the Wilder Communities Project, in partnership with the Warwickshire Wildlife Trust.
- SDC attends inaugural South Warwickshire Local Climate Engagement Programme (LCEP) event at the Royal Leamington Spa Town Hall - a collaborative day focused on accelerating locally led climate and nature action across the region and helping to build a cleaner, greener, fairer future for all.
- Third round of the Community Climate and Nature Fund supported a further six projects:
 - £10,000 to Welford-on-Avon Bowls Club to install 60 solar panels on their club roof, as well as the installation of battery storage.
 - £4,033 to Hoppers Lane Wood Trust to restore and plant on the 0.6ha Hoppers Lane Wood site.
 - £5,530 to Henley-in-Arden Parish Council to deliver their project titled: 'Henley Buzz and Bloom - Creating Colour, Habitat, and Heritage for Henley'.
 - £3,104 to Tysoe Tennis Club to upgrade the club's floodlighting to LED.
 - £6,000 to Henley Memorial Hall to install 3 air source heat pumps throughout the Hall.
 - £6,000 to Kineton Village Hall Association to install 2 air source heat pumps in their Hall.

LED STREETLIGHTS INSTALLED IN BEARLEY

The funding Bearley Parish Council received covered half the cost of upgrading 12 streetlights to LEDs. This enabled us to proceed more quickly with the project. The benefits of the project are not only reduced carbon footprint but also an ongoing monetary saving enabling more resource to be applied to maintaining and improving village infrastructure.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

Prior to the project, there were 12 streetlights in Bearley that used older, less energy efficient bulbs, such as sodium or mercury. These bulbs also had poor light output and were further deteriorating with age. The Parish Council identified this as a key local issue from a climate change, cost and residents perspective, which allowed them to produce a strong application. Upon the allocation of funds, the project was completed in two phases: 6 streetlights were replaced on 21st August, and a further 6 on 24th October.

IMPACTS

The annual energy consumption has reduced from 5944kWh to 2431kWh. This saving of just over 3500 kWh will save the Parish Council over £1200 each year based on the current unit price of c£0.35, and will reduce emissions by approximately 77kg of CO2 per year. Further savings will also be made from the reduced maintenance costs of LED lights, as they typically have double the lifespan of sodium or mercury bulbs. Residents and visitors now have improved visibility when entering and travelling around the village, and the cost savings have eased pressure on the Parish Council's budget.

Council Plan Priority Achievements - Health and Wellbeing



■ Health screening events

A total of seven events took place across the District in Stratford (two), Studley, Southam, Alcester, Shipston and Henley-in-Arden. These sessions gave residents across the district the chance to access vital blood tests at a concessionary rate, focusing on the early detection of prostate cancer, diabetes, and high cholesterol, conditions where early intervention can save lives.

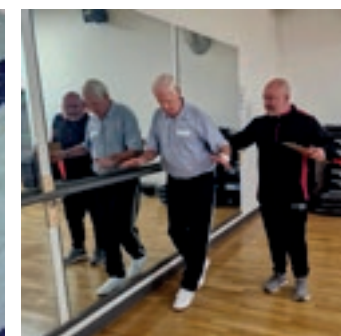
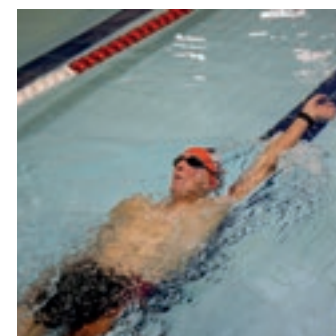
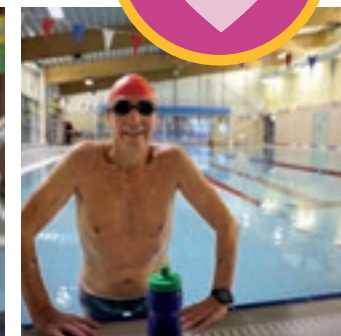
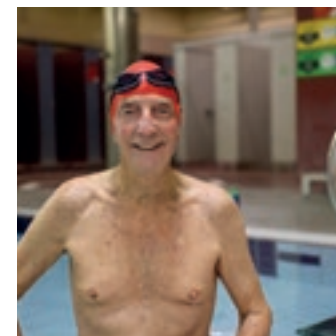
In total, 1,137 tests were carried out (this includes all tests (PSA, GHB and LIPP)), and the results speak volumes:

■ Prostate Cancer Screening:

663 men took part, with 156 (24%) referred for further tests via their GP, a crucial step toward early diagnosis and treatment.

From these referrals, early figures show that there have been 3 cases of confirmed cancer, but these results are just from the first event back in May as there is a time delay while further tests are completed.

However, it is well known that identifying the disease at an early stage significantly improves treatment options and outcomes, increasing the chances of survival, allowing individuals to take control of their health, enabling timely intervention and reducing the risk of advanced disease.



■ Diabetes and Cholesterol Checks:

A total of 204 diabetes and 270 cholesterol tests were carried out.

The findings were significant:

- 11% of participants showed blood sugar levels outside the normal range.
- A striking 80% had cholesterol readings that warranted follow-up with their GP.
- Free memberships at District Leisure Centres for those living with Parkinson's.
- SDC supports Everyone Active's Age is Just a Number campaign by encouraging over 60s to become physically and mentally active.
- Stratford Leisure Centre together with Stratford Hospital NHS Physiotherapist department hosts fitness classes created to prevent falls among older people.

Garden waste collections

There will be **NO** garden waste collections from Saturday 27 December 2025 through to Thursday 8 January 2026 inclusive.

Garden waste collections will resume as normal on Friday 9 January 2026.



Christmas tree recycling

We'll be collecting real Christmas trees from 9 to 23 January 2026 inclusive, and you don't need to have a garden waste permit subscription. Please ensure that all lights and decorations have been removed from the tree. Any tree that is over 5ft tall must be cut in half.

Leave your tree outside in a place that's not obstructing the public highway, and we'll collect it for you.

If you're subscribed to the garden waste service, you can chop it up and put it in your green bin.



Waste Collections

There will be no garden waste collections from **Saturday 27 December 2025 through to Thursday 8 January 2026**. Please take any garden waste to your local recycling centre.

Extra waste

Please note that no additional general waste (refuse) placed by or on top of your grey refuse bin will be collected.

If you have any additional recycling, you can place it in a box or rigid container next to your blue-lidded wheeled bin for collection. Please flatten or cut cardboard pieces no larger than 1 metre x 1 metre.

Please remember to put all your food waste in your food caddies and do not dispose of any batteries or electrical waste in your grey bin (general waste).

Overview and Scrutiny Committee Meeting updates

The Overview and Scrutiny Committee (OSC) has held four meetings since the last update in August.

27 August 2025

On **27 August 2025**, South Warwickshire University NHS Foundation Trust (SWUFT) attended to provide an update regarding the Ellen Badger Hospital in Shipston-on-Stour. Clarification was given around the services which would be provided at the hospital, the integrated care model, and the development and funding of the renovations to the hospital. SWUFT made commitments to provide additional information following the meeting, including details of a community engagement event.

Also at this meeting, the Task and Finish Group on privately managed public open space was established. The Group has met on a fortnightly basis ever since, with updates being provided at each meeting of the OSC and is expected to report back to OSC and The Cabinet in the new year.

1 October 2025

On **1 October 2025**, the Committee held a discussion on Economy and Tourism. Representatives from both Shakespeare's England and Stratford-upon-Avon Business Improvement District were in attendance. Topics discussed included empty shops, changes to the tourism industry, employment, transport links and opportunities to advertise Stratford-on-Avon as a tourist destination.

The OSC also considered Cabinet reports on the Scrutiny Protocol (which it recommended by deferred for further consideration by members), Options for Boosting the Supply of Housing Land, the IndieGo Plus (formerly UBUS) Demand Responsive Transport, and the Fred Winter Centre Review.

30 October 2025

On **30 October 2025**, the Warwickshire County Council Portfolio Holder for Fire & Rescue and Community Safety was in attendance, primarily to discuss the County Council's Safe Accommodation Strategy. Members discussed the implementation of the Strategy, particularly across the District of Stratford-on-Avon, the support available to residents and families affected by domestic abuse, the importance of reporting domestic abuse and noticing the signs, and prevention work being carried out in communities.

The OSC also considered a number of Cabinet reports. The Scrutiny Protocol was reconsidered, with a recommendation being made to amend the Protocol to increase transparency regarding the Cabinet item prioritisation process. The Cabinet endorsed the Protocol with this amendment on 3 November 2025, and the final decision regarding its adoption is to be made by the Council on 8 December 2025.

- Stratford-on-Avon District Council Prevent Policy
- Enforcement Policy
- Strategic Risk Register
- Revenue Budget Monitoring Period 1 - 6 2025/26
- Capital Budget Monitoring Period 1 - 6 2025/26



Local government reorganisation updates have continued to be provided at each meeting, in the run-up to the Council's final submission to the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government on 28 November.
