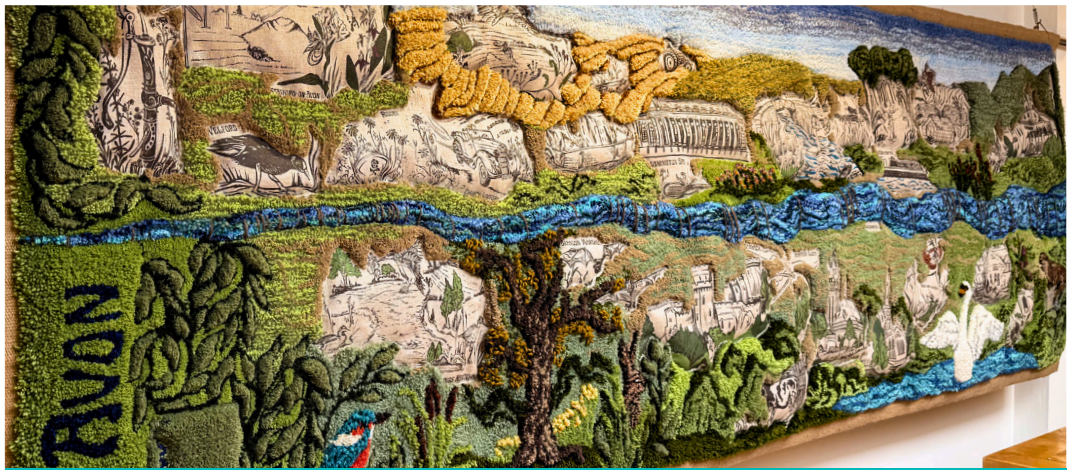

THE 2026 SHOW RECIPE

MALTED CHOCOLATE CAKE



Ingredients

30g malted chocolate drink powder, such as Ovaltine
30g cocoa powder
225g butter, softened, plus extra for greasing
225g caster sugar
225g self-raising flour
1 tsp baking powder
4 eggs

Method:

Heat the oven to 180C/160C fan/Gas4 and grease two 20cm round sandwich tins with butter. Line the bases with baking paper.

Measure the malted chocolate drink powder and cocoa powder into a large bowl, pour over 2 tablespoons of water and mix to a paste. Add the remaining cake ingredients and beat until smooth.

Divide evenly between the prepared tins and bake in the oven for 20-25 minutes. Set aside in the tins to cool for 5 minutes, then turn out on to a wire rack to cool completely.

To make the icing, measure the malted chocolate drink powder into a bowl, add the hot milk and mix until smooth. Add the butter, icing sugar and melted chocolate and mix again until smooth, then add the boiling water to give a gloss to the icing.

Place one cake on a plate and spread over half the icing. Sandwich with the other cake and spread (or pipe) the remaining icing on top. Arrange the Maltesers over the top.

For the Icing

3 tbsps malted chocolate drink powder
1 ½ tbsps hot milk
125g butter, softened
250g icing sugar, plus extra for dusting
50g dark chocolate (at least 50% cocoa solids), melted
1 tbsps boiling water
About 20 Maltesers to decorate

Tips for successful showing

Division 2

Class 17 Present on a show tray. **Classes 19-21** Put into water and clean with a soft brush. Show on a plate with parsley stalks for decoration. **Classes 22-23** Clean as above. Cut off tops at 3"/8cm. Display on show bench.

Class 25 Remove outer skins down to white stem. Tie leaves with green twine to prevent damage. **Class 27** Lift and show intact. **Classes 27-29** Lift ten days before. Remove cracked outer skins. Cut off top to 3-4"/9cms and bend over, securing with raffia. **Classes 31-32** Pick and wipe with damp cloth. **Class 34** Flowers if possible. **Classes 35-36** Present with stems/calyces. **Classes 38** Display on a plate.

All exhibitors must stage articles sent for competition. The committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage.

Prize money may be collected between 2.30 and 4.30 pm but no exhibit may be removed before 4.30 pm.

The committee have the right to disqualify any exhibit in Divisions 1 and 2 if proved not to have been grown by the competitor. The committee have the right of entry to allotment and gardens to view proposed entries.

The committee will appoint competent judges whose decisions in all cases are final.

No exhibitor may take more than one prize in any class.

Any complaints or objections should be made in writing to the secretary before 3pm on the day of the show. Such objections or complaints shall be considered by the officers and tent steward, whose decision shall be final.

Any infringement of the rules shall disqualify the exhibitor.

The committee shall not be held responsible for any mishap or accident arising from attendance of the show.

In the event of a tie for a cup the award shall go to the competitor with the most first, second or third prizes.

Any prize money not collected by 4.30 pm on the day shall be classed as a donation to the show.
